NTAC Publication Request Policy

The National Technical Assistance Center for State Mental Health Planning (NTAC) is proud to offer a variety of publications on mental health topics to its constituents, consumers, family members, academia, the media, peer organizations, and the general public at large. The goal of NTAC's publishing effort is to produce a wide range of materials designed to help State Mental Health Agencies and other NTAC constituents apply the knowledge gained through research, evaluation, and practice to mental health service settings.

To that end, our publications are available free (excluding Toolkits and Special Editions of networks) in quantities up to 10 total copies per order, per customer, per month. Bulk orders—11 or more copies—are available at a per copy price of .50¢ for networks; \$5.00 for Briefing Papers; and \$10.00 for Technical Reports. Toolkits are available at \$20.00 per copy (regardless of the quantity), and Special Editions of *networks* are \$2.00 per copy.

The aforementioned fees apply to all publication requests.

Note: NTAC-contracted authors automatically receive ten complimentary copies of each publication they write, and sponsors, reviewers, editors, and other direct contributors each receive one free copy of the relevant publication.
